## J. Edgar Hoover Honored By Resolution in the House

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP) -The House unanimously approved Thursday a resolution of congratulations and gratitude to J. Edgar Hoover in observance of the 40th anniversary this Sunday of his appointment as director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Speaker John W. McCormack of Massachusetts said "love of God animates his every action, and love of country."

Republican The leader Charles A. Halleck of Indiana Charles A. Halleck of Indiana, said Mr. Hoover had "earned and deserves the respect, con-fidence, admiration, yes, and the love of all the people of our country." The democratic leader, Carl Albert of Oklahoma, said Mr. Hoover is "one of the great public servants in the history of America." Many other Republicans and democrats, including two for-mer F.B.I. agents, praised Mr. Hoover on the House floor.
