STAMFORD, CONN., DEC. 1 (AP)-THE REV. MARTIN LUTHER KING SAYS HE PLANS TO ASK FBI DIRECTOR J. EDGAR HOOVER TODAY TO MEET WITH HIM TO DISCUSS THEIR DIFFERENCES.

HOOVER HAD CALLED THE NEGRO CIVIL RIGHTS LEADER "THE MOST NOTORIOUS LIAR IN THE COUNTRY" AT A RECENT WASHINGTON NEWS CONFERENCE.

KING SAID LAST NIGHT AT A NEWS CONFERENCE THAT HE WOULD REQUEST A MEETING WITH HOOVER "TO DISCUSS THIS ENTIRE MATTER."

HOOVER MADE HIS REMARK WHILE COMMENTING ON A STATEMENT ATTRIBUTED TO THE CIVIL RIGHTS LEADER THAT FBI ENFORCEMENT WAS NOT EFFECTIVE IN THE SOUTH.

KING WAS IN STAMFORD FOR A RALLY HONORING HIM FOR WINNING THE 1964 NOBEL PEACE PRIZE. "WE HAVE COME A LONG WAY," HE SAID OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT, "BUT WE STILL HAVE A LONG WAY TO GO."
