

Hoover Scores Peace Protests

WASHINGTON, Dec. 1 (UPI)
—J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, said Wednesday that most participants in demonstrations protesting United States involvement in Vietnam were "halfway citizens." In a letter to a former F.B.I. employe serving with the Marines in Vietnam, he said: "The small but highly vocal minority which is staging these anti-Vietnam demonstrations is, for the most part, composed of halfway citizens who are neither morally, mentally nor emotionally mature."
