## HOOVER ASSAILS 'MACBIRD!' AUTHOR

Also Denounces Organizers of Filthy-Speech Drives

WASHINGTON, March 31 (AP)-J. Edgar Hoover, the F: B. I. Director, has assailed organizers of campus filthyorganizers of campus filthy-speech movements and the au-thor of the play "MacBirdl", asserting that they were "de-termined to destroy all accept-able standards of personal con-duct and same behavior." Mr. Hoover made his attack in a forword to the Federal Bureau of Investigation month-

Bureau of Investigation month-ly Law Enforcement Bulletin, which is distributed free to 57,000 law enforcement offi-

cials. Small but vocal groups, he said, "seem bent on eliminating all ethical practices relating to our established order." He said the nation "cannot live with lawlessness, unbridled vulgari-ty, obscenity, blasphemy, per-version and public desecration of every sacred and just sym-bol." In an obvious reference to

production of "MacBird.", Mr. Hoover said: "We should be alarmed when widespread recognition and monetary awards go to a per-son who writes a 'satirical' piece of trash which malicious-ly defames the President of our country and insinuates he mur-dered his predecessor." Mr. Hoover scored "some groups, (who) under the guise of academic freedom and con-stitutional privilege, flood our college campuses with obscene four-letter-word campaigns and pornorgraphic publications which violate all codes of ethics." He urged Americans to "stop

ethics." He urged Americans to "stop deifying offbeat dolts whose ability is measured only by how they can dip their poisonous pens into the pots of blasphemy, filth and falsehood."
