MIAMI AP - J. Edgar Hoover plans to retire as director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation next Jan. 1 on his 75th birthday, according to reports Thursday from a Washington meeting of state attorneys general.

The Miami Herald reported i Friday's early editions that unnamed sources among the visiting state officials said they had been told of Hoover's impending retirement.

However, an FBI spokesman said: "Mr. Hoover has not indicated any plans to retire, and I don't think he has any intention of retiring anytime soon."

The Herald said its sources reported after conversations with Justice Department and wwhite House staffers: "It's my understanding wmr. Hoover will voluntarily step down on Jan. 1 and has said so."

The sources told a Herald Washington correspondent that they got the same understanding from other state and federal law enforcement officials during the three-day meeting of the National Association of Attorneys General.

Hoover has directed the FBI since 1924.
