Through the Years with FBI Chief



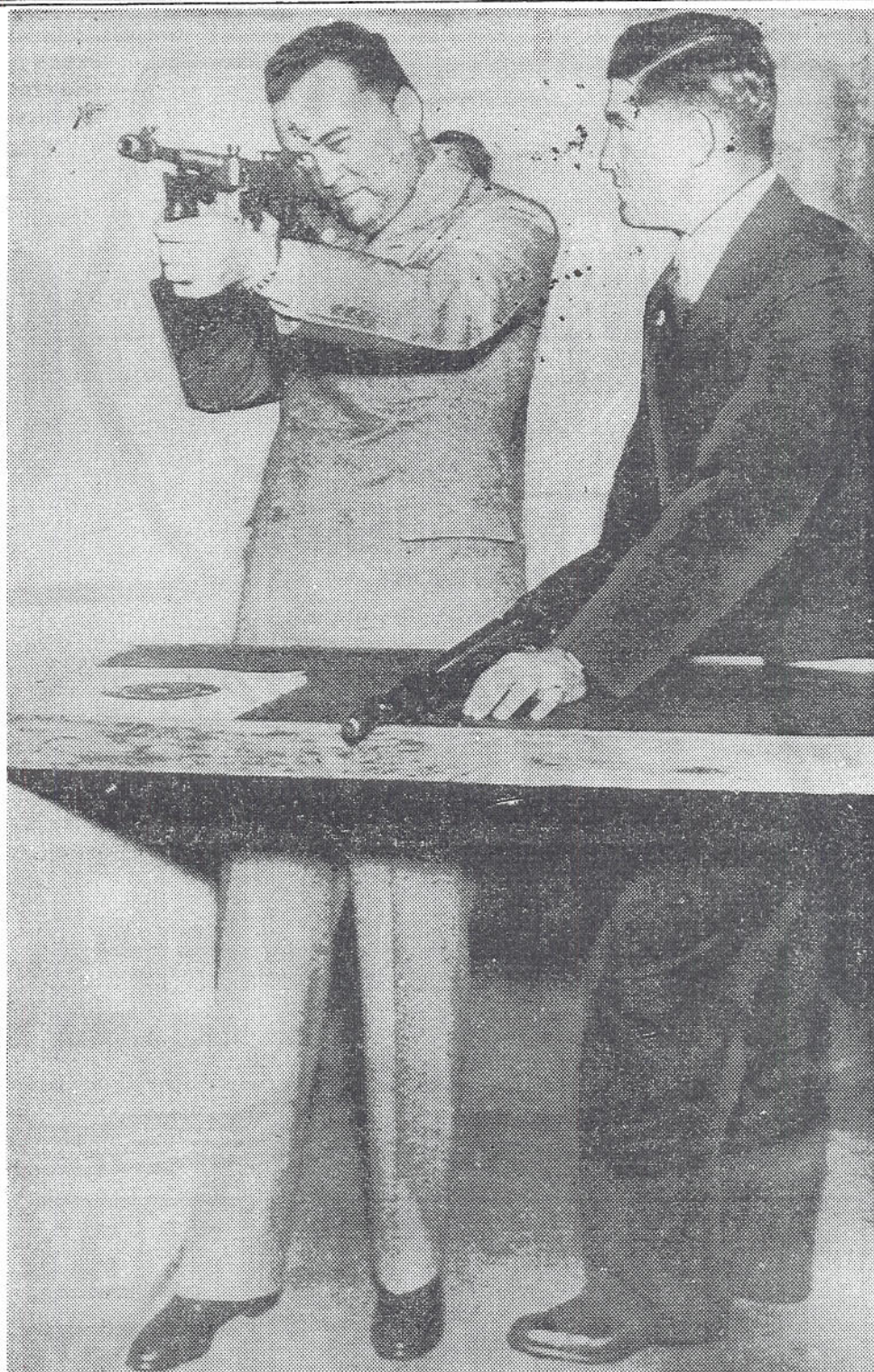
