WASHINGTON, MARCH 6 (AP)-THE STATE DEPARTMENT'S ADMINISTRATOR OF SECURITY AND CONSULAR AFFAIRS, ABBA P. SCHWARTZ, SAID TONIGHT HE HAS SUBMITTED HIS RESIGNATION TO PRESIDENT JOHNSON BECAUSE HIS JOB IS GOING TO BE REORGANIZED OUT OF EXISTENCE.

SCHWARTZ SAID THE REORGANIZATION PLAN WAS DRAWN UP "BEHIND MY BACK" AND HE LEARNED ABOUT IT ONLY ON FRIDAY AFTER RETURNING FROM A TRIP ABROAD.

A STATE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN DECLINED COMMENT ON EITHER SCHWARTZ'S RESIGNATION OR ON THE REPORTED REORGANIZATION PLAN, WHICH SCHWARTZ SAID HE EXPECTED WOULD BE SUBMITTED TO CONGRESS SOON.

THE STATE DEPARTMENT'S BUREAU OF SECURITY AND CONSULAR AFFAIRS AT PRESENT HANDLES PASSPORT, VISA AND REFUGEE AFFAIRS PLUS SOME SPECIAL CONSULAR SERVICES.

THE SECURITY ACTIVITIES ONCE UNDER THIS BUREAU WERE TRANSFERRED SOME TIME AGO TO AN OFFICE UNDER THE DEPUTY UNDER SECRETARY OF STATE FOR ADMINISTRATION, WILLIAM J. CROCKETT.

UNDER THE REORGANIZATION PROPOSAL, SCHWARTZ SAID THE PASSPORT AND OTHER FUNCTIONS IN HIS BUREAU ALSO WOULD BE PUT UNDER CROCKETT.

SCHWARTZ, AN APPOINTEE OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, HAS BEEN AT ODDS WITH SOME OTHER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON A NUMBER OF MATTERS INCLUDING PASSPORT QUESTIONS AND TRAVEL BY AMERICANS TO OFF-LIMITS AREAS ABROAD.

HIS POSITION CARRIES THE RANK OF ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE. HE TOLD A NEWSMAN:

"I SUBMITTED MY RESIGNATION LAST NIGHT TO BE ACCEPTED AT THE CONVENIENCE OF THE PRESIDENT.

"THE BASIS FOR THIS IS THE FACT THAT I WAS INFORMED ON FRIDAY THAT THERE IS A REORGANIZATION PLAN GOING TO THE (CAPITOL) HILL TO ABOLISH THE BUREAU. SO NATURALLY I TURNED IN MY RESIGNATION."
