Bremer Arraigned on 24 Counts

UPPER MARLBORO (Md.) — Arthur Bremer was arraigned on four state indictments, totaling 24 counts, in connection with the shooting of Alabama Gov. George Wallace on May 15.

Bremer was brought under heavy security to this Washington, D.C., suburb from the Baltimore county jail, where he has been imprisoned on federal charges in connection with the shooting at a nearby shopping center in Laurel, Md. Chief Circuit Judge Ralph Powers set his trial on state charges for July 12.

Because Bremer does not officially have an attorney

for the state charges, the court automatically entered

a plea of innocent on his behalf. After the hearing he was whisked back to the Baltimore jail under heavy guard.

Bremer Again Pleads Innocent

Arthur H. Bremer pleaded innocent yesterday to state charges in connection with the shooting of Governor George C. Wallace and the wounding of three other persons.

Bremer was taken from Baltimore county jail before dawn and brought under heavy guard to the Prince Georges county Circuit Court.

Bremer had pleaded innocent to federal charges last Wednesday.

The 21-year-old Milwaukee man was indicted last Tuesday on six counts for each of the four persons injured.

He was charged with attempted murder, assault and battery, assault with intent to murder, assault with intent to maim and two violations of state gun control laws.
