Forgot It Was Loaded

But, Brody said, he went through Canadian customs tracking Nixon to Ottawa, carrying a .38 caliber revolver in his pocket and completely forgetting that he had loaded the gun so that he fixed it accidentally that he fired it accidentally in a motel room. "Mr. Bremer was suffer-

ing from schizophrenia on May 15," Brody added. Brody said Bremer told

him he had fantasized about "being a big shot, perhaps because I am small."

Brody said he asked Bremer if he was referring to his stature.

Bremer answered, "No, my future is small. My past an insult to any human being."

Suicidal Mood

Brody acknowledged that at times Bremer wanted to commit suicide — by throwing himself under a train but said he did this out of a feeling of inability to relate to others and not derression.
