New Trial
For Bremer
Denied

Upper Marlboro, Md.

A motion for a new trial for Arthur H. Bremer, the assailant of Alabama Governor George C. Wallace, was rejected yesterday by chief Circuit Court Judge Ralph W. Powers.

Defense attorney Benjamin Lipsitz argued unsuccessfully that the prosecution's evidence was inadequate and that the jury had been prejudiced by news coverage of the attack.

Powers dismissed the motion after a 40-minute hearing.

Lipsitz has indicated he must now get \$2000 from some public or private source to pay for a transcript needed in further appeals.

Bremer has been held in the Maryland State Penitentiary in Baltimore since receiving a 63-year sentence August 4 on state assault and gun law charges.

He still faces trial on less serious federal offenses in connection with the shooting of Wallace and three other persons in a Laurel, Md., shopping center May 15.

Bremer Denied New Trial;
\$2,000 Needed for Appeal

UPPER MARLBORO, Md., Aug. 24 (AP) — Arthur H. Bremer, the assailant of Gov. George C. Wallace of Alabama, was denied a new trial today. Bremer's conviction on charges of shooting Governor Wallace and three other persons in Laurel, Md., last May 15 will be appealed, according to Benjamin Lipsitz, his attorney, when \$2,000 is raised to pay for the transcript of the trial.

Bremer was convicted and sentenced to a 63-year prison term Aug. 4. He is expected to serve his sentence at the Maryland State Penitentiary, a maximum security prison in Baltimore.

Circuit Court Judge Ralph Powers of Prince Georges County rejected the request, which Mr. Lipsitz based on the ground that at least one juror saw television news films of the shooting.
