## Wallace Assailant's Term Cut

Upper Marlboro, Md.

A three-judge appeals panel yesterday reduced by ten years the 63-year prison sentence given Arthur Herman Bremer for the shooting of Alabama Governor George C. Wallace and three other persons .

Bremer displayed no emotion when the reduction was announced by Judge Roscoe H. Parker after almost an hour of deliberations by the three Prince Georges County Circuit Court judges.

Parker said he and Judges William H. McCullough and James H. Taylor had considered the one hour of arguments, the pre-sentence report on Bremer and the transcript of the Circuit Court trial before making a decision.

But he gave no reasons why the judges decided on the ten - year reduction in sentence.

Bremer's attorney, Benjamin Lipsitz, filed an appeal of the state conviction earlier in the month. The arguments yesterday were strictly on the motion that the sentence be reduced.

Bremer still is under indictment on a Federal charge growing out of the attempted assassination of Wallace during a May 15 political rally at a Laurel, Md., shopping center. United Press
