BREMER RECALLED

AS A WALLACE AIDE

MONTGOMERY, Ala., Oct. 24
(AP)—One of Gov. George C.
Wallace's campaign workers says that Arthur H. Bremer, the man convicted of shooting Mr. Wallace, worked in the governor's Presidential campaign headquarters in Milwaukee for a month last spring.
Further, says Grey Hodges of Montgomery, Bremer had two chances to shoot Mr. Wallace on April 4, the day the Governor ran second in the Wisconsin Democratic primary, but he did not try. On that day, Mr. Wallace walked through a motel lobby once, then later greeted campaign workers.

Mr. Hodges, in an interview with The Alabama Journal, said that Bremer, 21 years old, "didn't act a bit out of the way, he was quiet, but he was a darn good worker," handing
