# Governor doubts 'loner' theory

## Shooting a plot, Wallace feels

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (Special) — Almost two years after the attempt on his life, Governor George Wallace believes the man who tried to kill him was part of a conspiracy and not a loner as the FBI has concluded.  
"You think one fellow can follow you around all over

the country, hardly ever made \$30 a week in his life," the governor asked in an interview at his offices here.  
"How can he buy an automobile, buy two guns or stay at the Waldorf Astoria, go to massage parlors, rent limousines, go to Canada, all over Michigan, follow me around?"

Wallace has questioned the FBI several times about the attempt on his life in Laurel, Md., on May 15, 1972, and about the man, Arthur Bremer, he was briefed on the investigation last fall.  
The FBI has said its inquiry is completed. Bremer, 22, is serving a 35-year sen-

tence in the Maryland state penitentiary at Baltimore. Wallace, 54, said he believes Bremer "cooled a little" after he was found on his way out, "relating his story" and "wouldn't feel any more pain" and he never came in his life before. The governor said
