

Kupferman Again Requests Release of Kennedy Data

Representative Theodore R. Kupferman, Republican of Manhattan, urged again yesterday that President Johnson make available to the public photographs and X-rays of President Kennedy taken after his assassination. They have been locked in the National Archives since last year.

Mr. Kaupferman, pointing out that the Freedom of Information Act becomes effective tomorrow, said in a statement that when the bill was presented to the House of Representatives last year "it was indicated that every effort would be made by the Administration to remove the veil of secrecy over papers and documents which could be revealed without violating the public interest."

He said that last March, when he requested permission to see the photographs and X-rays the administrator of the General Services Administration turned him down.
