U.S. INQUIRY IS URGED ON WARREN REPORT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28—
Representative Theodore R.
Kupferman asked Congress
Wednesday to conduct its own
investigation into the adequacy
of the Warren report on President Kennedy's assassination.

Citing recent books and articles critical of the report, the
Manhattan Republican called
for the creation of a 10-member
joint Senate-House committee
to review the Warren Commission's work.

The committee, composed of
five members from each house,
would first determine whether
there is a need to go beyond the
Warren Commission's investigation. This would be based on a
review of the commission's findings and also the critical writings and outside data.
