

A Warren Critic Asks New Probe

Edward Jay Epstein, author of the book "Inquest: The Warren Commission and the Establishment of Truth," told some 200 University of California students yesterday that the Warren Commission "conducted a superficial investigation" into the death of President Kennedy.

He called on the government to establish immediately panels of experts to re-examine the evidence.

He said that if the "single bullet" theory were abandoned "all the rest of the facts will fall down like a house of cards."

He said the commission was under severe deadline pressure and that most of the investigating was done by junior lawyers, the senior lawyers and the commission members being too busy to conduct a thorough investigation.

Although the public has much information on such things as the killing of Officer Tippett, he said, "we know virtually nothing about the assassination of the President himself."
