JFK Assassination Film Writers Want Probe Reopened

Mark Lane and Donald Freed, authors of the book "Executive Action" and the film of the same name, recently charged that the film's producer and distributors were not speaking for them when they stated that the picture is "nothing more than entertainment" and that "no re-opening of the (John F. Kennedy assassination) investigation is being sought."

Lane and Freed contend that "Executive Action," which concerns a right-wing plot to assassinate the late President, is non-fiction.

"We are seeking the opening of an independent investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy," said the writers, who will present their demands at a convention to be held at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C. today.

Chief organizers of the conference are writer Norman Mailer and Washington attorney Bernard Fensterwald, Jr., counsel to convicted Watergate burglar James W. McCord and director of the Committee to Investigate Assassinations.
