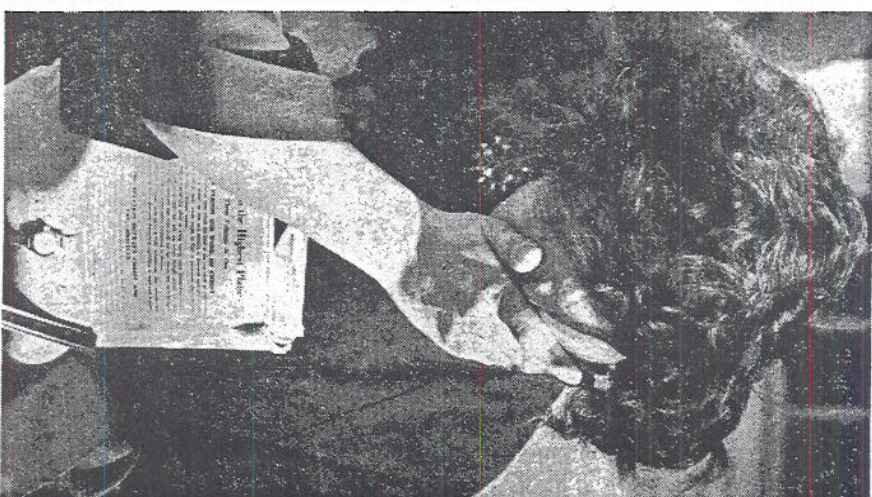

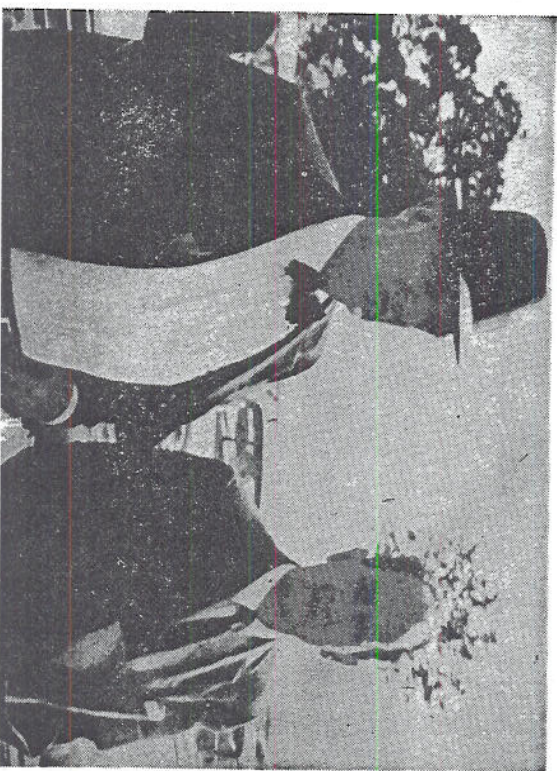

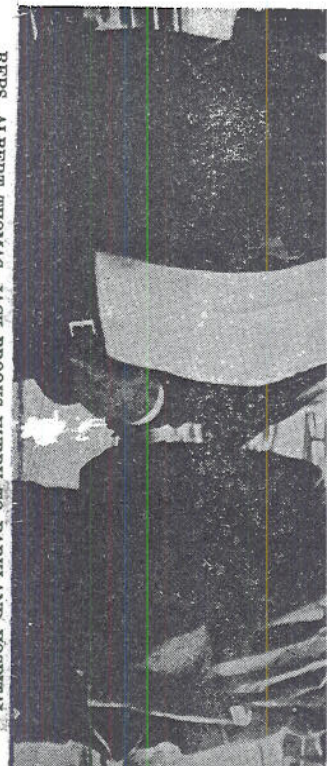

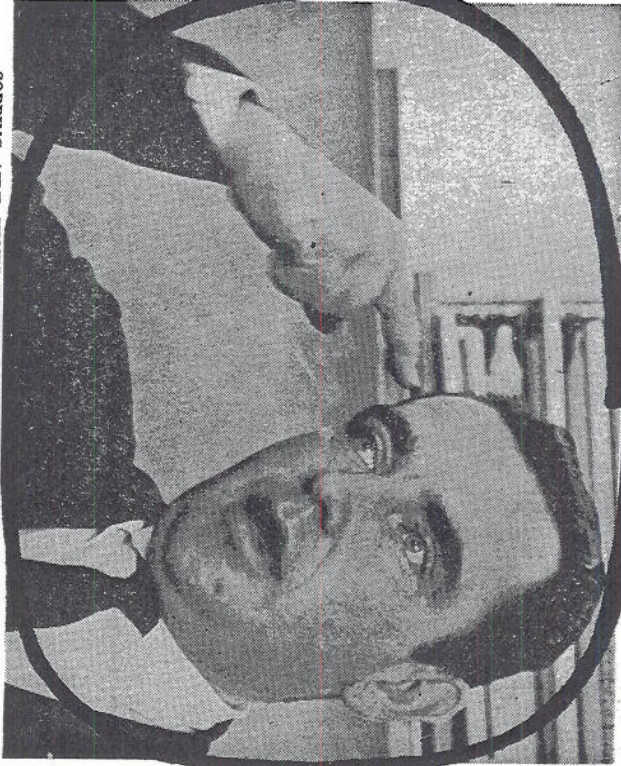

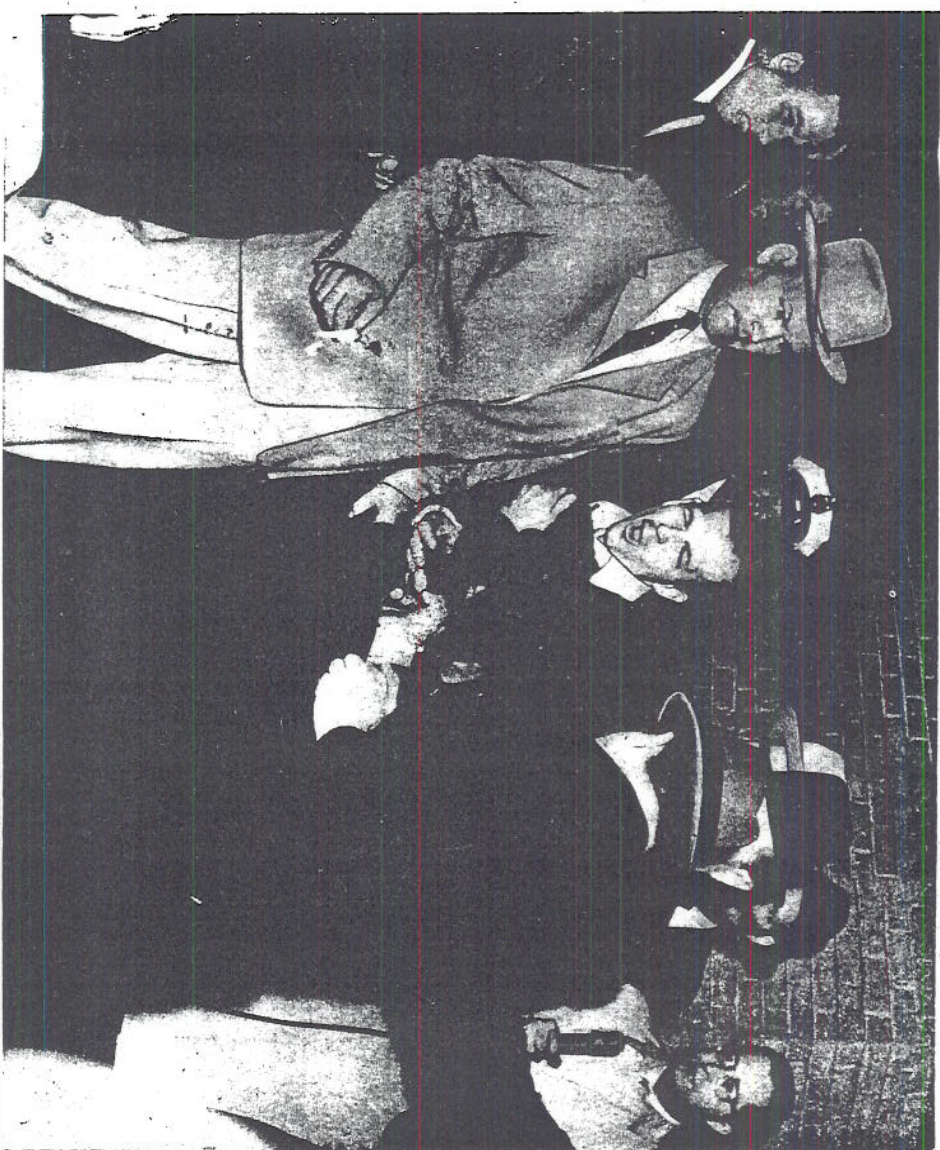

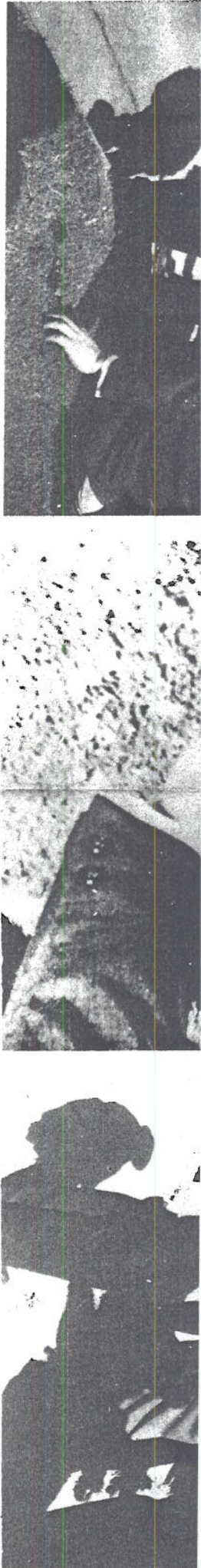

Deputy Sheriff Buddy Walthers and a Dallas policeman back away and permit a man to pick up a bullet about a foot from the south curb of Elm Street.
