The committee approved the plan by voice vote. It is scheduled for a vote by the full House today Passage is expected after considera-ble debate and possible amend-ment.

Under the resolution, the 12-member assassmation committee will be allowed to operate until March 31, and given a utidge of \$34,000 a month remeative to the start of the 95th Congress on January 4.

The resolution would require the committee — which came under fire for its bit spenting plans and the way it was organized — to submit a new set of rules and plans by March 31 of its life is to be extended through the current con-gressional session
