Oswald's 1977 letter to Hunt

DALLAS (UPI) — A Dallas newspaper yesterday said three handwriting experts have examined a controversial letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, and addressed to a "Mr. Hunt" and concluded that the writer was Lee Harvey Oswald.

The terse note asking "Mr. Hunt" for "information concerning my position" first was disclosed Feb. 6 by the Dallas Morning News. The letter was forwarded to the FBI.


The handwriting analysts, commissioned by the News and certified by the International Graphoanalysis Society, said the writing compared to that of Oswald in the Warren Commission report.

The note began, "Mr. Hunt. I would like information concerning my position. I am only asking for information. I am suggesting that we discuss the matter fully before any steps are taken by me or anyone else."

It was signed, "Thank you, Lee Harvey Oswald."

A Dutch journalist, Willem Oltmans, Friday quoted George de Mohrenschildt, a friend of Oswald who committed suicide earlier this week, as saying de Mohrenschildt was the middleman between the late oil billionaire H.L. Hunt and Oswald in a plan to kill Kennedy.

Spokesmen for the Hunt family have denied the accusations.
