**NIGHT LEAD WARREN COMMISSION**

**WASHINGTON, MARCH 31 (AP)-TWO EXPERTS ON GUNS SPENT ABOUT SIX HOURS TODAY TESTIFYING BEFORE THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMISSION INVESTIGATING THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.**

**J. LEE RANKIN, COUNSEL FOR THE COMMISSION, TOLD REPORTERS THAT THE TESTIMONY WAS "VERY FASCINATING," BUT HE DID NOT GO INTO DETAILS.**

**CHIEF JUSTICE EARL WARREN, CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION, SPENT A GOOD PART OF THE AFTERNOON GOING OVER VARIOUS MATTERS WITH RANKIN WHILE THE HEARING CONTINUED IN ANOTHER ROOM.**

**THE WITNESSES WERE ROBERT A. FRAZIER, AN FBI FIREARMS IDENTIFICATION EXPERT, AND RONALD SIMMONS, A WEAPONS EVALUATION EXPERT FROM FT. MEADE, MD.**

**THE COMMISSION ALREADY HAS LOOKED AT THE MAIL ORDER, ITALIAN-MADE RIFLE WHICH POLICE SAY WAS USED TO KILL KENNEDY IN DALLAS LAST NOV. 22.**

**THE RIFLE HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS BELONGING TO LEE HARVEY OSWALD. THE GUN WAS FOUND IN A CORNER OF THE SIXTH FLOOR OF THE DALLAS BUILDING WHERE OSWALD WORKED AND FROM WHICH POLICE SAY THE SHOTS WERE FIRED.**
