Washington, May 5 (AP)- The Warren commission called more FBI witnesses today, apparently to talk about FBI checks on Lee Harvey Oswald before President John F. Kennedy was killed.

A spokesman identified the witnesses only as having had some connection with investigation of Oswald before the assassination.

They are John W. Fain, and FBI agent now retired; and John L. Quigley and James B. Hosty Jr., FBI agents.

The FBI has said very little about its checks on Oswald, the 24-year-old loner who once lived in Russia for 20 months, sought Soviet citizenship unsuccessfully and brought a young Russian wife back to this country.

Oswald was charged with murder in Kennedy's death last Nov. 22 in Dallas.

A Dallas policeman has quoted Hosty as saying, soon after the fatal shooting, that the FBI knew Oswald "was capable of assassinating the President."

FBI chief J. Edgar Hoover replied that "that is absolutely false." Hoover said the agent made no such statement "and the FBI did not have such knowledge."

An assistant to Hoover, Alan Belmont, is scheduled as a witness tomorrow before the commission investigating Kennedy's assassination. Belmont is scheduled to explain FBI procedures used in investigating the assassination and identify documents.
