Washington, June 1 (AP)- The Warren commission's report on President John F. Kennedy's assassination is expected to substantiate the original FBI finding that Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, murdered Kennedy.

The commission has completed its basic work and set the end of the month as the target date for a report expected to detail the evidence that Oswald was the assassin and acted alone.

The commission plans to call several more witnesses including Kennedy's widow, who will testify at a secret time and place. She was riding in the car with her husband when he was gunned down in Dallas last Nov. 22.

In the meantime commission staff froups are drafting separately the segments of what may be a 500 page report. With its supporting documents and testimony, the report is expected to rival in extent and size the massive report of the Pearl "arbor commission after World War II.

The commission has heard some 400 witnesses along with thousands of investigative reports and at least 800 pieces of physical evidence. They are said to have overwhelmingly substantiated the FBI finding that put the finger on Oswald glone.

Barring a sensation reversal of information in the next month, officials indicated the report would present evidence to show that:

- 1. Oswald, the sfl-taught Marxist, hater of authority and unstable ne'er-do-well, designed and executed the murder without helpers or co-conspirators .
- 2. Jack Ruby, the night club owner who shot Oswald to death 48 hours later and thus destroyed all hope of getting a confession, had not known Oswald and was not involved in any plot to silend him. Ruby has been sentence to death for slaying Oswald, and is appealing.
- 3. No connection can be developed between the assassination of Kennedy and any plot developed in Russia, Cuba or Mexico. Oswald had visited Russia and Mexico, and had thied and failed to get Soviet citizenship.
  - 4. The motive apparently lay in Oswald's embittered and introverted

ming . His "ussian-born wife said he had become "abnormal" and evidence MXXI disclosed that his mother had earlier ignored a school physician's recommendation that he be given psychiatric treatment.

Some sources said the commission's greatest problem has been to establish that the crime could not or might not have been committed by someone other that Oswald, or by a secret group using Oswald or helping him.
