WASHINGTON, JUNE 3 (AP)-IN THE NEWS FROM WASHINGTON:

WARREN COMMISSION: THE WARREN COMMISSION, INVESTIGATING THE SLAYING OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, HAS DECIDED TO HEAR MORE TESTIMONY FROM THE WIDOW OF ACCUSED ASSASSIN LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

IN ANNOUNCING TUESDAY THAT MRS. OSWALD WOULD RETURN ON JUNE 11, THE COMMISSION DECLINED TO SAY WHY SHE IS BEING RECALLED. SHE TESTIFIED AT LENGTH EARLY IN THE COMMISSION'S HEARINGS.

TOMORROW THE COMMISSION WILL HEAR FROM SEVERAL GOVERNMENT AGENTS
CLOSELY CONNECTED WITH THE INVESTIGATION. THEY INCLUDE FBI SPECIAL
AGENTS LYNDAL L. SHANEYFELT AND ROBERT A. FRAZIER, BOTH OF WHOM
TESTIFIED EARLIER, AND INSPECTORS LEO GAUTHIER OF THE FBI AND THOMAS
J. KELLEY OF THE SECRET SERVICE.

DALLAS DIST. ATTY. HENRY WADE AND POLICE SGT. PATRICK T. DEAN OF THE DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT ARE SCHEDULED TO APPEAR MONDAY. A NUMBER OF PRESENT AND FORMER STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYES ARE SCHEDULED TO TESTIFY NEXT TUESDAY, INCLUDING LEGAL ADVISER ABRAM CHAYES AND ADMINISTRATOR ABBA P. SCHWARTZ OF THE BUREAU OF SECURITY AND CONSULAR AFFAIRS.

SECRETARY OF STATE DEAN RUSK IS DUE TO APPEAR NEXT WEDNESDAY,
JUNE 10, AND JAMES J. ROWLEY, CHIEF OF THE SECRET SERVICE, IS SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 16.
