Nixon a Target?

Question for Mrs. Oswald

Washington

Marina Oswald, widow of the accused assassin of President Kennedy, was questioned yesterday about reports that she once locked up her husband to prevent his carrying out a threat to kill former Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

The questioning was carried out behind closed doors by the special investigating commission, headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren, which

was appointed by President Johnson to dig out the facts in the Kennedy assassination.

Mrs. Oswald, 22-year-old Russian-born widow of Lee Harvey Oswald, had previously testified before the Warren commission last February.

No official reason was given for recalling her, but one commission member, former Central Intelligence Agency director Allen Dulles, told newsmen that "we have

learned a great deal about the case since she was here before."

Other sources said the commission was particularly anxious to question her about reports it has received that she locked Oswald in his room when Nixon visited Dallas last November 21 (the day before President Kennedy was shot) because he had threatened to kill Nixon.

Commission sources did not reveal whether Mrs. Oswald confirmed the report.
