## Date Unknown For Release of Warren Report

JOHNSON CITY, Texas—President Lyndon B. Johnson said Saturday he could give no indication when the Warren Commission report might be issued on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

He noted that the chief justice and other members of the presidential commission investigating the slaying "have been at it for a good while."

The commission was praised for persistently pursuing every possible lead.

"When their report is completed," he said, "I assume they will submit it to the President and at that time I will be glad to review it carefully and make such decision as I may feel that the national interest requires."

The commission was created by the President after the Nov. 22 assassination in Dallas of President Kennedy and wounding of Texas Gov. John B. Connally by the same sniper.

*Following is a transcript of President Johnson's news conference at the LBJ Ranch yesterday, as recorded by The New York Times, through the facilities of ABC News:*

### 4. The Warren Report

Q. Mr. President, could you give us any indication when the Warren report may be released, sir?

A. No, that's a Presidential commission. I asked the Chief Justice and other members to serve on it. They've done a very—they've been at it for a good while, and they are very insistent that they pursue every possible lead. When their report's completed, I'll assume they will submit it to the President and at that time I'll be very glad to review it carefully and make such decision as I may feel the national interest requires.
