Date Unknown For Release of Warren Report

JOHNSON CITY, Texas-President Lyndon B. Johnson said Saturday he could give no indication when the Warren Commission report might be issued on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

He noted that the chief justice and other members of the presi-dential commission investigating the slaying "have been at it for a good while."

The commission was praised for persistently pursuing every possible lead.

"When their report is complet-ed," he said, "I assume they will submit it to the President and at that time I will be glad to review it carefully and make such decision as I may feel that the national interest requires."

The commission was created by the President after the Nov. 22 assassination in Dallas of President Kennedy and wounding of Texas Gov. John B. Connally by the same sniper.
