WASHINGTON, JULY 28 (AP)-INDICATIONS ARE THAT THE COMMISSION INVES-TIGATING THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY WILL NOT MAKE ITS REPORT BEFORE SOMETIME IN SEPTEMBER.

THE COMMISSION, HEADED BY CHIEF JUSTICE EARL WARREN, HAS ACCUMULATED A MASS OF EVIDENCE THAT SOME OF THE MEMBERS WANT TO REVIEW FURTHER BEFORE A REPORT IS ISSUED.

WITH CONGRESS DRIVING FOR ADJOURNMENT BEFORE THE DEMOCRATIC NATION-AL CONVENTION STARTS AUG. 24, SENATE AND HOUSE MEMBERS ON THE COMMIS-SION ARE LIMITED IN THE TIME THEY CAN GIVE TO THE COMMISSION'S WORK.

SEN. JOHN SHERMAN COOPER, R-KY., ONE OF THE MEMBERS, SAID TODAY HE PLANS TO STUDY THE EVIDENCE IN MORE DETAIL DURING THE CONVENTION. IT WAS UNDERSTOOD THAT SEN. RICHARD B. RUSSELL, D-GA., HOPES TO DO SO ALSO.

COOPER TOLD A REPORTER HE WOULD NOT BE SURPRISED IF THE COMMISSION TAKES ADDITIONAL TESTIMONY BEFORE MAKING ITS REPORT. THE COMMISSION HAS NOT HELD ANY MEETINGS SINCE BEFORE THE REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION.

SOURCES CLOSE TO THE COMMISSION SAID THAT THE TIME REQUIRED FOR FINAL REVISION OF THE DRAFT OF THE PROPOSED BOOK LENGTH REPORT AND FOR ALL MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION TO READ IT AND MAKE SUGGESTIONS, ARE THE CNLY FACTORS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DELAY. THEY SAID THERE IS NO DISAGREEMENT ON THE SUBSTANCE OF THE REPORT, WITH ITS FINDING THAT THE KILLING WAS THE SOLE WORK OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND THAT NO PLOT WAS INVOLVED.

AT ONE TIME PUBLICATION OF THE REPORT HAD BEEN PREDICTED FOR JULY.

BUT ONE SOURCE WELL INFORMED ON THE COMMISSION'S ACTIVITIES SAID TODAY

THERE IS NO CHANCE IT WILL BE READY FOR DISTRIBUTION BEFORE LABOR

DAY.

"THE SECOND WEEK OF SEPTEMBER WOULD BE A GOOD GUESS," HE SAID.
