Confidential note to telegraph editors:

White House press secretary George Reedy advises, on an off-the-record basis, that the Warren commission's report on the assassination of President Kennedy will be distributed to accredited newsmen at 8 a.m. EST Friday, wsept. 25, for release at 5:30 p.m. EST Sunday, Sept. 27. It will be embargoed from movement on the wires or outside the country until 2 a.m. EST Sunday.

Reedy said a limited number of sets of glossy reproductions of all illustrations contained in the report will be available, but requests that those needing the glossy prints notify the press secretary's office in advance. There will be more than 150 photographs, charts and other illustrations in each set.

The length of the report is now estimated at 296,000 words. The first chapter will be a summary of about 10,000 words.

The volume will contain 864 pages of which 706 pages are text and the rest illustrations.

You will be advised Wednesday regarding the AP's plans for wire movement of stories, textual material and illustrations from the report.

The double embargo on transmission and release of the report requires that no story be moved by any wire service or news agency or any media to a client until 2 a.m. EST Sunday.

Reedy reports that it is expected that some of the approximately 20 volumes of supplementary hearing transcripts will be completed in time for distribution along with the commission's report, but probably not all of them. Contents of these hearings volumes will be subject to the same embargoes as the report itself.
