

EARL WARREN SIGNS FOR BOOK ON CAREER

Earl Warren, whose 45 years of public service ranged from district attorney in San Francisco to Chief Justice of the United States, will cover his career in a book he has been signed to write for Doubleday & Co.

Kenneth McCormick, editor in chief of Doubleday, who will edit the 79-year-old former Chief Justice's manuscript, said Monday that the book was expected to contain a full and candid account of Mr. Warren's early years in California politics as well as of his 16 years as Chief Justice.

"He plans an anecdotal, warm and vital book which he hopes to do in the next 18 months so we can publish it in 1972," Mr. McCormick said.

Mr. Warren is completing a 40,000-word manuscript, tentatively titled "The Responsible Citizen," scheduled for publication next year by Quadrangle Books, a wholly-owned subsidiary of The New York Times.
