'The case is not closed'

Mother: 'This Is Not Justice'

FORT WORTH (Texas)—(AP)—The mother of Lee Harvey Oswald slammed her fist down on a bound copy of the Warren Commission re-

clared: "I can break this whole thing apart—I'm going to make fools of them."

Mrs. Marguerite Oswald said the commission report—which concluded that her son was the assassin of President John F. Kennedy—was "ridiculous. . . . I can tear this book apart." She was not specific.

'NOT JUSTICE'

"I am not bitter, I am indignant. This is not justice," she said.

She said she had been "conditioned" by published accounts of what the report would contain and "I am not now shocked. The case is not closed.

"I have facts in my possession that make me believe in my son's innocence. Therefore, this will compel me to continue my investigation with renewed vigor."

SOLD LETTERS

Mrs. Oswald, 57, graying, stout and still outspoken, spent the entire right reading the commission report. She said it had been mailed to her special delivery from Washington.

Still living in her small apartment, she is not regularly employed. She recently sold some of her son's let-

ters to a national magazine and has made a recording concerning the assassination.

She criticized the omission from the Warren Report of a detailed account of her son's slaying. The commission said its report in this area was limited in scope because the Jack Ruby case was still pending.

Mrs. Oswald charged that the report should not have been released until the Ruby proceedings were completed and hinted that the release date was linked to "political reasons."

"My son was murdered and I have a right to know the facts," he said.

DALLAS, Sept. 27.—(AP)—eHads of law enforcement agencies in Dallas either had "no comment" or were not available for comment today regarding the Warren Commission report.

'Shame'—Cries Lord Russell

LONDON — (UPI)—British philosopher L o r d Bertrand Russell said yesterday the Warren Commission report on the assassination of President Kennedy was "a sordidly incompetent document and covers its authors in shame."

The 92-year-old philosopher, whose statement was issued four and a half hours before the official release of the report, charged the Warren Commission "consists of men so close to the investigatory agencies of the United States that they would be ineligible to serve as jurors."

Oswald Widow: No Comment

RICHARDSON (Texas) — (UPI) — Marina Oswald, the widow of Lee Harvey Oswald, worked on her forthcoming book yesterday and was not available for comment on the Warren Commission's findings.

'Marvelous Reporting'

IRVING (Texas) — (AP)—Mrs. Ruth Paine, the housewife who was sheltering Lee Harvey Oswald's wife and children at the time of the assassination of President Kennedy, said yesterday she thought the Warren Commission had done "a marvelous job of reporting . . . everything I read of the report was extremely accurate."

She said the report had brought out something hitherto unknown to her — that Oswald had left his wife \$170 in a dresser drawer when he left Mrs. Paine's suburban home the morning of the tragedy.
