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Report Proves No Surprise to **Tippit's Widow**

DALLAS (AP)—The widow of slain Police Officer J. D. Tippit said Sunday she wasn't surprised by the Warren Com-mission statement that her husband knew neither. Lee Harvey Oswald nor Jack Ruby. "We knew that all along," she

said with a smile. Then she grew wistful.

Nov. 22. Tippit was shot to death when he attempted to question Oswald.

More than \$600,000 in dona-tions for the Tippit family poured in from all over the nation after the officer's death but his widow said that the family is living on \$225 month.

She explained that lawyers are completing details on form-ing trust funds but that in the meantime, she and her three children have been living on Tippit's police benefit pay-ments ments.

She says her life probably will change little, even after she starts receiving the con-tributions. She wants her chil-dren brought up in the manner Tippit had planned. She fore-sees no moves from their Oak Cliff nieghborhood, about 12 miles from downtown Dallas.

"I don't know how those rumors got started..., J. D. was just an honest, hard-working policeman who stayed at home most of his free time."
