Asked about mounting criticism of Warren Report, said he travelled a great deal in other parts of the world and had encountered almost universal disagreement abroad with the conclusions of the Warren commission, but the critics focused on "miniscule details". He himself accepted the commission's conclusions. Had known Mr. Warren all his adult life and could not believe he would be a party to deceiving the American people.

Asked about growing demands for examination of autopsy photographs and x-rays, said "I am not going to get into that detail."
