
Probe Report on JFK Slaying

Washington

The Rockefeller Commission investigating the Central Intelligence Agency has received "no credible evidence" that the CIA had any involvement in the assassination of President Kennedy or that Lee Harvey Oswald was not, as the Warren Commission found, the lone assassin, the panel's executive director said yesterday.

David W. Belin said that

the commission took evidence from a group headed by former comedian Dick Gregory regarding an allegation that E. Howard Hunt Jr., a figure in the Watergate case, had been seized near the Kennedy assassination site within minutes of the shooting in Dallas.

Hunt denied the allegation in testimony before the commission.
