## **ASSASSINATION BILLS** INTRODUCED IN HOUSE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4 (AP) A bipartisan group of 11 House members introduced bills Mon-day to make it a Federal crime to attack or assassinate a President. The sponsors included Repre-sentative Gerald R. Ford Jr., Re-publican of Michigan, who was a member of the commission that investigated the assassina-tion of President Kennedy. Representative Richard S. Schweiker, Republican of Penn-sylvania, who is leader of the group that introduced the bills, said they would also cover the Vice President, or any other official next in line of succes-sion to the Presidency, as well as a President-elect and a Vice President-elect. Federal agencies now take part only unofficially in any such investigation, and only at the invitation of local authori-ties. Mr. Schweiker, who intro-

ties. Mr. Schweiker, who intro-duced similar legislation in the 88th Congress, said the Warren Commission had pointed out that such legislation would in-sure Federal arrest of any sus-pect, and protect him from vigilante justice and other threats.
