

Warren Data to Be Made Public

The hearing transcript and exhibits of the Warren Commission's inquiry into the assassination of President Kennedy will be made public November 30. 26 volumes weighting 54 pounds.

The White House announced yesterday that the mass of testimony will become available for publication and broadcast at 6:30 a.m. (EST) Monday, November 30.

The testimony, which led to the commission's finding that Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, killed Mr. Kennedy in Dallas last November 22, will be sold by the Government printing office in complete sets only, at \$76 a set.

The hearing transcripts of several hundred witnesses and contents of thousands of investigation reports are bound in hard-cover volumes and will not be available from the Government — as the commission's report was — in less expensive paperback binding.
