**Warren Report Sells**

The Warren Commission's report on the assassination of President Kennedy has had the greatest volume of initial sales in the history of the Government Printing Office bookstore here.

In the three weeks since the report went on sale at the bookstore for \$3.25 in cloth cover, \$2.25 in paperback, 97,000 copies have been bought.

The only Government publication comparable in initial sales was "The Surgeon General's Report on Smoking and Health." It sold 44,000 copies, 10,000 the first day.

The all-time best seller in the history of the bookstore, which dates back to 1895, is "Infant Care." This has sold about 13 million copies since 1914.

A spokesman for the bookstore says that most orders for the Warren report are for the hard-cover volume.

"The people seem to feel they are buying something historical to leave to their children and grandchildren. That's why they want the hard-cover edition at \$1 extra," he said. It weighs 3 pounds 2 ounces and has 912 pages.

Print orders by at least a half-dozen other publishers are already into the millions of

**Warren Report Still Selling**

WASHINGTON, March 25 (AP)—Almost six months after publication of the Warren Report on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, 140,233 copies have been sold and orders still come in daily. What is extraordinary, a Government Printing Office spokesman said today, is that 1,442 sets of the hearings, at \$76 apiece, have been sold.
