

World Awaits Report

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — "The President is instructing the special commission to satisfy itself that the truth is known as far as it can be discovered, and to report its findings and conclusions to him, to the American people and to the world."

Those were the concluding words of the White House statement last Nov. 29 announcing creation of the Warren Commission to investigate the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

At 6:30 p.m. (EDT) Sunday—almost 10 months to the day—the world will be told of the commission's findings. Few if any surprises are predicted.

THE REPORT is expected to say that Lee Harvey Oswald, the 24 year old ex-Marine turned Marxist, was solely responsible.

Further, it is expected to say that night club owner Jack Ruby, Oswald's killer, had no prior link with him nor with any "conspiracy."

IT IS believed the report will go far toward scotching the conspiracy rumors, especially widespread in Europe.

The commission members and their staff have heard hundreds of witnesses, sifted through a small mountain of documents, photographs, personal letters—and several times visited Dallas.
