Washington.

The report on the assassination of President Kennedy was staff-written, not the work of any single author, Warren Commission officials said yesterday.

At the drafting stage, staff members sat in on conferences at which Chief Justice Earl Warren and his fellow

commission members discussed the evidence, reached general conclusions, and indicated the general findings to be embodied in the report.

With this guidance each staff group wrote its draft of a section or partial section. The seven commission members studied them independently, then brought pro-

posed changes, rephrasings or corrections back to full meetings for discussion and revision.

Staff men again sat in, then wrote new drafts. The process was repeated until all members were satisfied with all sections.
