The Jig-Saw of Evidence

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WASHINGTON-The Warren Commission put together a vastly complicated jigsaw puzzle of evidence -- some pieces as hard, clear-cut and incontrovertible as steel, some as wispy as a spider's web-in concluding "that Lee Harvey Oswald was the assassin of President Ken-nedy."

Tiny, seemingly insignificent bits of material or ver bal evidence were put to test after test of laboratory and logic, checked and crosschecked and carefully weighted before they were thrown into the balance.

THE FINDINGS

On the basis of the evidence which it metculously reviews in the report released yesterday the commission found that Oswald:

"(1) Owned and possessed the (Manlichter-Carcano 6.5 millimeter) rifle used to kill President Kennedy and wound Governor Connally,

"(2) Brought this into the Texas schoolbook) depository building o nthe morning of the assassination, "(3) Was present, at the

time of the assassination, at the window from which the shots were fired,

"(4) Killed Dallas Police Officer J. D. Tippit in an apparent attempt to escape,

(5) Resisted arrest by drawing a fully loaded pistol and attempting to shoot another police officer (in the Texas movie theater), "(6) Lied to the police

after hi sarrest concerning important substantive matters,

"(7) Attempted, in April 1963, to kill Maj. Gen. Edwin A. Walker, and

"(8) Possessed the capability with a rifle which would have enabled him to commit the assassination." 100 PAGES

port of these conclusions fills more than 100 pages of the report. But here is one ex-ample, how the case was built on ownership of the assassination weopon.

HANDWRITING CHECK Document examiners for the Treasury Department and the FBI "testified un-Department equivocably" that the handprinting and writing on the mail order and money order was the same as that appearing on documents known to have been written by Oswald, such as letters, passport application, and indorsements

Among other cards found in Oswald's handwriting and a photograph of Oswald on it. As one of the ways in which apparent "sure thing" bits of evidence were put to further tests, the Italian Armed Forces Intelligence ords, found that a rifle with Service established that this particular rifle was the only rifle of its type bearing the

FINGERPRINTS Beyond that, fingerprint evidence established to the commission's satisfaction that Owald had handled two of the four cartons next to the window from which the assassin fired his fatal shots and also handled a paper bag which wa found near the cartons.

The report adds:

"Oswald was seen in the vicinity of the southeast corner of the sixth floor approximately 35 minutes before the assassination and no one could be found who saw Oswald anywhere else in the building until after the shoot-

An eyewitness to the shooting immediately provided a description of the man in the window which was similar to Oswald's actual appearance. This witness identified Oswald in a lineup as the man most nearly resembling the man he saw and later identified Oswald as the man he observed.

"Oswald's known actions in the building immediately after the assassination are consistent with his having been at the southeast corner window of the sixth floor at 12:30

p. m. "On the basis of these findings the commission has concluded that Oswald, at the time of the assassination, was present at the window from which the shots were fired." Hearst Headline Service
