MOSCOW, Oct. 14—A Soviet weekly with a circulation of 325,000 copies has printed a 3,000-word summary of the findings and conclusions of the Warren Commission's report on the assassination of President Kennedy.

The latest issue of the The Soviet weekly also printed an editorial note quoting Western newspaper comments to show that doubts persisted in some quarters.

The summary, prepared by the United States Information Agency, was the most nearly yet published in the Soviet Warren Commission's report on the assassination of President Kennedy.

The latest issue of the week-ly Za Rubezhom introduced the summary with a covering letter from Ambassador Foy D. Kobhler expressing the belief that the report would end unfounded rumors and assumptions.
