What has happened to Justice Fortas is regrettable. What has happened to the American people is alarming. We have been clearly told that one man, the Attorney General, has the power to use the full resources of the Federal Government to conduct an investigation and then release all or part of the findings to the press, as he sees fit, with no review by judge or jury.

The success of this procedure constitutes a dangerous precedent.
