

Most Asked Believe LBJ Good Man

To most of the people interviewed downtown Sunday afternoon, President Lyndon B. Johnson, is "a good man."

As people gathered in front of the Arena for the holiday folk fair, they displayed hope for the future of the United States.

"We're all Americans," said Louis Frank, 262-A E. Denton av., St. Francis. "We may fight among ourselves sometimes, but when something like this happens, we all work together."

Frank said that he thought because of the late President Kennedy's assassination, "Johnson will have the support of both parties."

"Sorry for Him"

"I feel very sorry for him," said Mrs. Malinda K. Canfield, 727-A W. Walker st. "He was more or less in the background as vice-president, and now he has to make the decisions. Even with congress behind him, he'll need help."

A New Yorker, John Bartelt, 21, said "I think anyone with his experience would make a good president."

Philip Eisfeldt, 21, of Watertown, said he saw the late President Kennedy in person once and was impressed.

Eisfeldt said he thought that Mr. Johnson would be a good president, but added, "If there

is any reason why he would not be accepted, it would be because of his personality. It's not as outstanding as President Kennedy's."

"Seems to Be Sincere"

"President Johnson seems to be a sincere person, although it's too soon to tell how he will do as president," said Herb Hansen, 1214 S. 123rd st., West Allis.

Mrs. Clarence Conrad, 1964 S. 75th st., said, "I think President Kennedy honestly tried to achieve world peace. I hope that President Johnson succeeds in carrying on the relationship Mr. Kennedy achieved with Russia through peaceful settlement."

"I don't know," answered Mrs. W. Heiby, of Deerfield, Ill., when she was asked what kind of a president Mr. Johnson will be. "I imagine the Kennedy policies will go through out of respect for the president, especially those concerning civil rights and taxation."
