Todd Cooley Hist. 391 Wrone 11 Nov. 87 In analyzing the photograph of John Kennedy's shirt and reading the portion of the Warren Report on this , the following are my conclusions regarding the shirt.

- A) In regard to the nick on the neck tie, the tie was not penetrated thoroughly. The inner lining was not disturbed, nor were there any sources of bullet fragments left on the tie to indicate a bullet had passed through the material.
- B) In reference to the hole created in the shirt, this hole is located too low for it to have been created by a bullet exiting the neck wound on Kennedy. Also if it were a bullet hole, it would be smaller and semicircular due to the shape of the projectile. The fibers along this torn area leave no indication of a bullet passing through them. There are no traces of lead or any indication that if a bullet did pass through, which way it was travelling. (Lines 49-51) The report assumes that it was an exit hole (lines 27 and 39), yet there is no conclusive evidence of this.
- C) The Commission asserts in lines 49-51 of this page "that the panel itself cannot assess the evidentiary significance to the fiber direction because of the numerous intervening examinations". So how can the Commission use this as evidence of an exit wound when they are not even sure of the facts themselves? Hoover

and the FBI (lines 27 and 39 ) indicate the threads have the characteristics of an exit hole. Yet they do not list the characteristics in which they are referring to. So what facts are they basing their conclusions on ?!?
