The Select Committee on Assassinations, in March 1979, looked into the wound on the anterior of President Kennedy's neck. They say that this wound is a neck wound from an exiting bullet. In this case as in others regarding the assassination, facts and evidence are manipulated to fit the conclusion. This committee, it appears, never considered that the wound was an entrance wound. This would ruin the case that Oswald acted alone in the Assassination.

The major evidence used is that of shirt fibers which are bent outward. They also say however that "the FBI laboratory's initial description did not offer evidence concerning the direction of the fibers", p. 89(256) A correspodance is also key here in which Hoover says "These characteristics are typical of an exit hole" p. 89(255). Neither of these two instances show any hard evidence of fibers pointing outward, these are merely inferences. There is also the possibility these fibers were tampered with to appear to point out (There was an immediate examination.)

In conclusion I feel this idea of an exit wound is supported by the committee to escape the possibility of a conspiracy. This evidence is proposed so the public will feel Oswald was the killer.
