I have a narrow interest in the part marked as it relates to Amheson, marked it while reading so I could copy that excerpt, no other reason....There is a part of this history usually lost on historians and political writers, Dean Rusk's as, I think, G-3 on Stilwell's staff, replacing, of all people, my source, Bob Castorr, who was and remains strongly pro-Stilwell and the only extreme conservative I know who feels things had to go the way they did in China, that Stilwell was right on all points, and that the real control over the form of Chinese government was ours, and we made it what it is. He was as anti-Chiang as Stilwell....
