Please let us know if it appears worthhile. Impossible to say from the few excerpts carried by the AP and the NYT.

Also enclosed here are some things you wished returned from your 3rd class D mailing, which contained the two TV programs mixk xiencick on Eagleton. Agree he stood up remarkably well. McG just let himself be pushed out of shape on this and we cannot excape the feeling it will cost him. However we do agree with You and Lil that Shriver is the best possible substitute under the circumstances. Your letter to Shriver, by the way, is most impressive, and it will be interesting tosee how he responds, if he does.

Re the Scientology-Process memo, we don't think we have any foreseeable interest, but of course one never knows. It is entirely foreign to us, exeept for a prior reference you once made to it. If we may, we'il rely ong you to let us know if anything turns up.

Among other things in your 21 and 22 was a proposal that Martha was just doing what came naturally and that the flacks seized upon it to use in the general foofarah they generated trying to obscure the real nature of the Watergate caper. We entirely agree, and any impression we may have conveyed to the .contrary was simply a matter of not being clear.

Re the WC, suggest you read carefully the long AP feature enclosed, by Dick Barnes. It contains a few crumbs that are new to us, and might be to you. We had not realized, for instance, that Hunt had appeared before the grand jury.
