11/5/72 I found some interest in the Issues & Answers program. The first half was Shriver and I think he did very well. ^He has turned into a rather good campaigner and one who I think in the future may attract many of the young, including the disaffected and those without hope. If the earlier part of the campaign had been like this, ti would lock different today. ^Gradually some ideas about that have been forming in my mind but I've not had time to put them down. The second half was two pollsters. I found it interesting also, not as much for what they said as for what could be read into it. I don't know if this can interest you, but I'll save the tape until you have time to let me know. If I don't hear anything, I'll assume you do not have the time or it doesn't intrest...I have finally finished going over all the frafts of papers to be a letter he will detest. 't will probably mean the end of any relationship. Few things could be -

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more inmour interest. The only alternative is that he change and stick to the change. His word of the past has been as good as Garrison's.
