

House Assassinations subcommittee investigating the death of President John F. Kennedy, said yesterday the post-mortem examination of Kennedy's body showed a hematoma, or blood clot, in the upper back beneath the shoulder blade. But he said its cause has never been revealed.

1: Brooten said if a bullet fragment had caused the blood clot it would constitute "physical evidence that there was a conspiracy" because the wound could not have been caused by the bullet which entered the back of Kennedy's neck and exited his throat, then striking Texas Gov. John Connally."
