House Assassinations subcommittee investigating the death of President John F. Kennedy, said yesterday the post-mortem examination of Kennedy's body showed a hematoma, or blood clot, in the upper back beneath the shoulder blade. But he said its cause has never been revealed.

Brooten said if a bullet fragment had caused the blood clot it would constitute "physical evidence that there was a conspiracy" because the wound could not have been caused by the bullet which entered the back of Kennedy's neck and exited his throat, then striking Texas Gov. John Connally."

Brooten said yesterday the subcommittee made no mention of whether a fragment was discovered or of the hematoma itself.
